A message from our General Manager



Welcome to the December 2025 Ernest Henry Update

Hello, and happy holidays! It is hard to believe that the festive season is upon us again. I wish you and yours all the best over the coming weeks and hope you get a chance to relax and enjoy the company of friends and family. Then, it's on to 2026.

As always, it has been a busy few months for us at Ernest Henry. We have had quite a few visitors recently, highlighted by a visit to Cloncurry in early October by the Evolution Board of Directors. They last visited in mid-2023 so a lot has changed since they last saw us. It was a hectic visit, with a full day on site where they got to see the entire operation and catch up with many of our team. A highlight of the visit was a dinner at Chinaman Creek Dam hosted by Mayor Greg Campbell and Cloncurry Shire Council. It was great to be able to show off the partnership we have built with Council and the Directors were impressed both by the location and the positive engagement.

A key focus of our current work is to advance the mine as part of the extension project that we have been discussing for the past few years. This includes getting ready for a mine life out to 2040 and beyond. Of note, we recently commissioned the first truck loading loop setup on the 1100 level (about 1100 metres below surface). Our next ten years will see most of our ore loaded onto underground trucks and hauled up to our existing crusher conveyor system, located on the 1175 level. We also commissioned an upgrade to the ventilation system, that's sends fresh air underground. This will enable us to mine from deeper underground, at rates similar to the levels above.

Critical to our extension will be securing an amendment to our environmental approval. This submission is currently with the Department of Environment, Tourism, Science and Innovation (DETSI) for review, and we are expecting a decision soon. We recently concluded the public consultation for this so DETSI will now use this feedback to make a decision on our amendment. We look forward to keeping you updated.

On the exploration front, our Discovery team has been active in the area on our tenement package in recent months, undertaking both aerial geophysical surveys and surface drilling. This work recently wound up for the season. The team will now spend the next few months processing the data they have received to develop a list of targets for next year's program. I expect that they will look to restart their works after the wet season.
